
- Aims to identify, develop and test tools, methodologies, and approaches to include persons with disabilities in IFAD operations and rural development overall

Working with Disability Inclusion Facilitators

A Disability Inclusion Facilitator (DIF) is a person that supports awareness and implementation of disability inclusion in mainstream programmes, services, organisations or workplaces



82 young persons with disabilities were trained as Disability Inclusion Facilitators

31 mentors were trained and guide the DIFs in their inclusion work







- DIFs provide professional advice to IFAD projects, beneficiaries, and other stakeholders on how to make disability inclusion work, tailored to their different contexts.
- Awareness session were also organized for Inclusive Farmer Groups using the Picture Box Tool
- In 2022 & 2023 DIFs provided 1.185 professional services reaching out to more than 50.000 people across the four countries



The combination of lived experience of disability and technical expertise on disability inclusion brings forth practical advice and creative solutions.



Disability Inclusive Programming in practice

- 518 of staff from IFAD funded projects, implementing partners, and service providers have been trained on disability inclusion
- Disability inclusion was benchmarked at program/organisational level for participating IFAD programmes/operational actors and other key stakeholders.
 14 Disability Inclusion Action Plans are being implemented
- Targeted partnership with Organisations of Persons with Disabilities (OPDs)









Disability Inclusion activities – Burkina Faso

- Advocacy at the national level for the adaptation of production sites for persons with disabilities and participation of persons with disabilities in decision making bodies
- Cooperatives are including of producers with disabilities
- Collaboration between OPD, MFI and project for access to credit for project participants with disabilities

Disability Inclusion activities - Mozambique

- Agricultural and Nutrition Fair was organized in coordination with the IFAD funded program PROCAVA, and district stakeholders
- More than 300 people participated in the event, where 130 people were people with disabilities - participants of PROCAVA

Disability Inclusive Value Chain Assessment Tool (DIVCAT)



Value chain interventions are analysed from a disability-inclusion perspective and persons with disabilities are included in the most promising nodes and sectors in terms of business and jobs opportunities.

DIVCAT is developed with a **gender lens** and is based on the framework to conduct Gender sensitive value chain analysis

DIVCAT tool has been applied in the honey, airy, cowpeas, rice and Soumbala in Burkina Faso and Malawi

 their own problems in the future








Innovation labs and co-creation spaces
